Chicks are in high demand. Ordering early is very important! We only order based on orders we receive. Reserve your chicks now! Chicks are ordered as pullets. **Mistakes in sexing are beyond our control.** They must be ordered a minimum of **one week** before desired pickup date and the minimum order is **(6) chicks per pickup date.** All poultry must be paid for at time of order and picked up on the day of arrival.

**** Due to shipping challenges, chicks may arrive before or after expected pickup date.****

Ameraucana: Extremely docile, family friendly birds. They are both heat and cold hardy. Hens weigh around 6 pounds and grows to be a variety of colors. They lay around 200 medium blue eggs per year.

Barred Rock: Dark gray to black with white stripes, these birds are zebras of the chicken world! They are very cold-hardy. They lay large brown eggs, and tend to range from 250 - 300 eggs per year.

Buff Brahma: Large, tan and black birds who reach around 7-8 pounds. They are very calm and docile. Laying brown eggs and are winter hardy. Average around 200 eggs per year.

Buff Orpington: Very large, fluffy, and heavyset solid yellow birds. They are moderately good layers (200 - 280 eggs per year), but are excellent pets as they enjoy being around people. Hens weigh around 8 pounds.

Easter Egger: Extremely docile, family friendly birds. They are both heat and cold hardy. Hens weigh around 5 pounds and grow to be a variety of colors. They lay large colorful eggs that range from olive green to turquoise blue.

Midnight Majesty Marans: Typical of Marans they are very docile and friendly. It has dark black and brown coloring and is a larger bird weighing 7-8 pounds. Being cold and heat hardy they lay up to 250 large dark brown eggs per year.

Olive Egger: Dual purpose birds that lay a deep green colored egg. They lay around 150-200 large eggs a year. These active and docile birds are cold and heat hardy. They are rarely broody.

Rhode Island Red/ Blue: Heavier birds who are also dual-purpose. Excellent layers of large, light to medium brown colored eggs. They are a dark red or a blue-grey, and have some black feathering in their tails. Hens weigh around 7 pounds.

Salmon Faverolles: Extremely friendly, talkative birds. They are a great addition to a backyard flock, laying up to 180 light brown to pink cream colored eggs per year.

Sapphire Gem: These foraging birds lay an average of 290 extra large brown eggs per year. They have a light blue or lavender coloring. They are very winter hardy, heat resistant and occasionally broody. Docile and friendly.

Speckled Sussex: Heavy, dual-purpose birds who are also very cold hardy. Good layers of large, light brown and tinted eggs. Their plumage is distinct as they have a dark mahogany base.

Starlight Green Egger: These birds are very similar to the Prairie Bluebell Egger being lightweight and active. Laying up to 280 large green eggs per year, they are excellent foragers.

Welsummer: Medium sized birds who are heavy layers - 250+ large brown speckled eggs per year when mature! Hens weigh around 5-6 pounds and are a rustic red color with brown. Excellent cold-hardiness.

White Leghorn: These snow white birds lay an average of 280 - 300 eggs per year. Unlike the other mentioned breeds, they lay large/extra large white eggs. They are very athletic birds, so they're non sitters.

Turkeys:

Broad Breasted (BB) White: Very large turkeys bred for meat production. These are your typical grocery store variety turkey, and can reach 50 pounds at full maturity. Their white feathers leave no pin marks when the birds are dressed.
